Rules & Regulations.

**Vicious dogs are not eligible and must not be brought in the show
Exhibitors are held responsible for any damage done by their dog during this exhibition.**

1. The Show will open at 11-00 am
2. Dogs will be received all day but it is the exhibitors responsibility to ensure that exhibits are Available for judging when required.
- 3 Judging will commence at 12.00 noon
4. The show will close half an hour after after judging has been completed by which time All dogs must be removed, Exhibits may be removed from the show after there judging has Been completed, Exhibits may not be removed any earlier unless by written order of the Veterinary Surgeon, Veterinary Practitioner or of the show management and then only in very Exceptional and unforeseen circumstances which must be reported to the Kennel Club.
- 5 The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of tenting and benching areas is forbidden Except as authorised by the show management.
6. Entry fees; Members first entry per dog £5.00 subsequent entries with the same dog £2-00 Per class,
Non Members; First entry per dog £6-00, subsequent entries with the same dog £2-50 per class.
Not for competition £0-00.
7. Prize money; £25-00 FOR Best in Show
- 8 The committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries
9. Puppies under six calendar mounts of age on the day of the show are not eligible for Exhibition
10. The mating of Bitches within the precincts of the show is forbidden
11. **Best Puppy in Show.** Where a best puppy in show competition is scheduled, the best Puppy in show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy Exhibited at the same show .A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it will automatically be Best Puppy in Show, Similarly if the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has Only been beaten by an adult dog it will also automatically be Best Puppy in Show. Consequently, WITHDRAWAL FROM OTHER COMPETITION.
Selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show.
Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition, other than Breed Classes prior to the competition for Best Puppy in Show as Appropriate, in order to remain unbeaten. A puppy beaten in competition for Best Puppy in Show May subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dog Declared Best Puppy in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.
PROVISO: For the purpose of this regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a special award confined to one breed will not be considered to be a Beaten Dog.
12. **Best in Show.** The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which had completed and is Unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same Show.
Best in Show must be selected from exhibits declared Best of Sex providing they are unbeaten Winning dogs. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.

Rules and Regulations Cont;

The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show must not compete in any Subsequent competition

Dogs which become eligible for Best in Show maybe withdrawn from all other competition, Other than breed classes prior to the competition for Best in Show as appropriate to remain Unbeaten. A dog beaten in competition for Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited In all competition for which it was previously eligible, The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.

PROVISO For the purposes of this regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special award confined to a single breed, will not be considered to be beaten dogs.

13. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has Elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have Been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the show management.

14. No modifications will be made to the schedule except by permission of the General Committee of The Kennel Club which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.

15. All exhibitors must be familiar with The Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the preparation of dogs for exhibition.

16. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries Without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.

17, **DOGS IN CARS ON HOT DAYS.** Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot wheat her And the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and Don't's travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.

When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.

If your vehicle is not air conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good Idea.

The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with Lot's of water available to drink.

Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight, there should be plenty of free flowing air around The dog.

When at the show never leave your dog in the vehicle

Keep your dog in the shade, take your own shad for example a large umbrella and always have Plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.

Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for Extended lengths of time.

Remember If you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this Could lead to dire results. Please look after your dogs welfare. **WARNING; If your dog is found To be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any Damage caused.**

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps To ensure the needs of their dogs are met, and should not put a dogs health and welfare at Risk by any action, default,omission or otherwise in breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this Respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under KC rules and regulations. **Right to Refuse Entries** Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies **Have the right under Kennel Club Regulations to refuse any entry.**

Rules and Regulations Cont;

18 Any owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove Any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club licensed show s within the licensed Venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and Approaches, Adequate receptacles for the disposal of such fouling will be provided.

19. The Owner, Exhibitor, Handler or other person in charge of a dog at Kennel Club licensed events must at all times ensure that the dog(s) is kept under proper control Whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches.

20. A dog may be disqualified by the General Committee from any award whether an objection has been lodged or not, if proved among other things to have been a) registered recorded as having been bred by the scheduled judge, this shall not apply to a judge Appointed in an emergency,b): exhibited without payment of the appropriate fees.

21. Every exhibitor shall ensure that whilst the dog is being exhibited its handler shall display The correct ring number,

22. The committee of the show cannot accept responsibility for products advertised or sold by Stand Owners at the show, and wish to remind exhibitors that grooming products On sale may not meet the requirements of the Regulations of the Preparations of Dogs for Exhibition.

23 Not for competition entries will be accepted, details of each dog so entered must Be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club Registered.

Definition of Classes

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any show award that counts Towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by The Kennel Club.

Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not On offer shall count as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members classes or competing For members specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class lie. 03/10/2010

Wins in variety classes do not count for entry in breed classes but when entering in variety Classes, wins in both breed and variety must be counted, A first prize does not include a Special Prize whatever the value.

If an exhibitor reports before judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered Which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

1) Withdraw.

The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of regulations 9(j) And 20.

2) Transfer:

2a If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards it's colour, sex, weight or height The show secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour Sex, weight or height and, in the event of their being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy And Puppy except to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

2b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class or Puppy Class, which is over The age but under twelve calendar months of age or eighteen months of age respectively, The Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class or the Junior Class Respectively of the correct colour, sex, weight or height, and in the event of there being no Puppy or Junior Class to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

Definition of Classes cont.

(c) For any reason other than the above, the show secretary shall transfer it to the Open Class for the correct sex, colour, weight and height.

(d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY; For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the show.

PUPPY; For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the show

YEARLING. For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty four calendar months of age on the first day of the show

NOVICE. For dogs that have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more First prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

GRADUATE. For dogs that have not won a Challenge Certificate or four or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open Classes, whether restricted or not.

LIMIT. For dogs which have not become a Show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club, or won seven or more first prizes in all Championship Shows in Limit and open classes confined to the breed. Whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN. For all dogs of the breed for which the class is provided and eligible For entry at the show.

VETERAN. For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the show.

BRACE. For two exhibits (either sex or mixed) of one breed belonging to the Same exhibitor, each exhibit having been entered in some classes other than Brace or Team.

BREEDERS; For dogs bred by the exhibitor.

Kennel Club Regulations F (Annex B)

Regulations For The Preparation of Dogs For Exhibition. F (B)

1. These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared For any Kennel Club Licensed event, Objections may be refereed to the General Committee whose decision shall be final and may Include reference for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A 42.

2 (a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture, or body Of the coat for any purpose at any time during the show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may Be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the show

(b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in preparation Of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.

3 No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part There of may be performed except;

(a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.

(b) The removal of dew claws of any breed.

(c) The shortening of tails in customary docked breeds, but only up to a acceptable age limit which shall be prescribed from time to time.

(d) Operations to prevent breeding, provided that such operations Are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown. Nor Anything be done calculated in the opinion of the General Committee to Deceive.

4. The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any Dog or dogs at any show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person Having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.

5 An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he / she is the owner Or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class, An objection may however Be lodged by an official of the show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will Substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.

6 Any objection by the individual related to an infringement of these regulations must Be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the show and the Individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

Safety Notice:

The SEOES Club is committed to the relevant general duties as prescribed in the Health and Safety at Work Act 1974, and will endeavour to put into place the relevant safeguards as prescribed along with other legislation in industry recognised Standards in the Approved Codes of Practice. The club will also conduct its Undertaking to ensure as far as reasonably practicable that all visitors, officials and Exhibitors are not exposed to risks to their health and safety. Safety officers will be appointed to oversee any Health and Safety issues prior, during and immediately after the show. The club's committee calls for immediate action to correct any issues by their safety officer.
